



COVID -19

Guest Rules, Policies and Procedures

Effective – Stage 2 – July 14, 2020

- **DO NOT visit MLRA facility or Office if you are sick or mandated to quarantine or isolate.**
- **Leave the facility immediately if you develop symptoms of COVID-19.**

Members will be permitted a limited number of guests on a restrictive basis. Our goal is to allow a safe number of people in the facility with priority access to our members. It is the responsibility of our members to ensure compliance with all government guidelines and laws. At this time we are only allowing guests that are within your Cohort group, as defined by the Alberta government. Please click [HERE](#) for the government guidance documents. Your guests are NOT permitted in the facility unless they meet the definition of your Cohort group.

Days Guests may be permitted access

- Members may be permitted to sign in guests Monday through Friday, from 9am – 12pm, with **Restrictions**, as outlined in this document.
- Guests are not required to leave the facility before 12pm, but must leave before or at the same time as the member who signed them in.
- Guests will NOT be permitted access on Saturdays, Sundays, or holidays.

Guest Limits

- Members between 12 and 18 years of age may sign in 1 guest (non-member) per day. The guest must be 12 years of age or older. Household limits apply.
- Members 18 years of age and older are permitted to sign in 1 guest (non-member) per day of any age. Household limits apply.
- Adult members are permitted to bring in one other family to a maximum of 5 people, providing all family members are from the same household. Household limits apply.
- A household limit of 5 guests per day applies to all situations, and it is the responsibility of members within the household to organize.
- Please find a list of examples below:
 - Alan is a father of 2 kids. He would like to bring in his sister and her husband and their 3 kids for them to play together. Alan could sign in all 5 of these guests, however, the household limit is now maxed out so no one else from Alan's household could sign in a guest.
 - Alan brings in a friend, his friend's wife, and their child for a total of 3 guests. Alan's partner Brady also would like to come to the park and bring 2 guests who live together, but not in the same house as Alan's guests. Although this would be within the household limit, Alan has already signed in one family so Brady could only sign in 1 guest.
 - Barb has signed in a family of 4 people and would like to bring in 1 other friend. Barb would Not be permitted to sign in her friend in this situation, or any other person.

- Carlos is an adult and has 5 family members that he would like to bring as guests, but they do not live in the same household. Carlos would only be permitted to sign in the guests that live in the same household.
- Danielle and Erik have 3 grandchildren and would like to bring them in as guests. If all 3 grandchildren live in the same family household, either Danielle or Erik could sign in all 3, or they could divide the children so Danielle signs in 2 and Erik signs in 1. This is providing the household max of 5 has not yet been reached.
- Faith is an adult and would like to sign in 2 friends but they live in different households. Faith would only be permitted to sign in 1 friend, not both.

Guests that are permitted at anytime

- Members under the age of 12 who are not yet old enough to access the facility on their own will be permitted access providing they are accompanied by a person who is over the age of 21. This person does not need to be a MLRA member but must be part of the family cohort group, as defined by the government of Alberta. MLRA office must be notified in advance for specific approvals and notes will be added to member's profiles.
- A caregiver or family member within a cohort group will be permitted access to the facility providing they are accompanying a MLRA member who requires assistance or supervision. MLRA office must be notified in advance for specific approvals and notes will be added to member's profiles.

Guest Rules

- The member must be present and enter the facility with their guest(s), and remain in the facility with their guest at all times.
- Members are responsible for the actions of their guests.
- It is the responsibility of members to ensure their guests are familiar with all Association policies, procedures and rules.
- The Association reserves the right to limit the number of guests and to refuse guests access to the facility.

IMPORTANT

These procedures have been developed within the guidance of health officials and may be amended at any time without notice. This document will be posted online on our website (www.mlra.ca) and it is the responsibility of all members to ensure they have read, understand, and will comply. Any member refusing to comply will be requested to leave the premises immediately and may be suspended until further notice. Direct concerns to management – manager@mlra.ca.
